

# UTES Medication Administration Policy

***ONLY THOSE MEDICATIONS THAT ARE MEDICALLY NECESSARY DURING SCHOOL HOURS FOR A STUDENT'S ATTENDANCE OR DIRECTED BY A HEALTHCARE PROVIDER SHOULD BE SENT TO SCHOOL.***

- Parent/guardian must give written permission for medication to be administered at school. [Medication Parental Permission Form](#) [Spanish Form](#)
- Medication must be in the original, properly labeled container (name of medicine with strength, dosage and directions; if prescribed, name of health care provider, current date).
- For prescribed medication, the RX label must contain the student's first and last name.
- Non-prescription medication dosage must agree with manufacturer's recommendations or a health care provider's order will be required.
- Medication must be FDA approved for the indicated treatment.
- An [Allergy Action Plan](#) and/or [Asthma Action Plan](#) needs to be completed and signed by student's physician for allergies or asthma requiring medicine.

The first dose of this medication for the current condition/illness *may not be given at school.*
