Senate Bill 11	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Each district/charter school shall establish a school safety and security committee (SSSC)• Threat assessment and safe and supportive school team (SSST) will serve each campus
House Bill 496	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bleeding Control Measures• Bleed control training is required for charter school personnel who “may reasonably be expected to use a bleeding control station”.• Bleed control kits; must have “more than one [bleeding control station] per campus• Training October 9th for staff• Additional training – Spring 2020
Behavior Threat Assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Assessing and reporting individuals who make threats of violence or exhibit harmful, threatening, or violent behavior• Gathering and analyzing data to determine the level of risk and appropriate intervention• Provide guidance to students and school employees on recognizing harmful, threatening, or violent behavior that may pose a risk to the community, school, or individual
Baseline Data Reporting – Behavior Threat Assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Due November 13, 2020 to TEA<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Whether your district or charter school has received training on behavioral threat assessment, and established a functioning behavioral threat assessment process.2. The roles of personnel conducting the behavioral threat assessment.3. The number of campuses served by a functioning behavioral threat assessment process.4. The number of threats assessed using behavioral threat assessment during the 2019-2020 school year.



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	This data will be collected using a survey and will be based on the activities that occurred from September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

Campus Safety Drills	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Minimum 8 drills per school year• Lockout – 1 per school year; Lockdown – 2 per school year; Evacuate – 1 per school year; Shelter in Place- 1 per school year; Hold – 1 per school year; Fire Evacuation – 1 per school year
Safety and Security Grant	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Awarded \$50,000 from TEA• Security cameras at UT Elementary
