House Bill 496 Bleeding Control	 Bleeding control training is required for charter school personnel who "may reasonably be expected to use a bleeding control station."
Measures	 To receive the required certification, the training must be in-person (online training is not allowed).
	• The law requires district or charter school to offer instruction to students on
	 bleeding control. It does not require students to receive instruction. Campuses must have "more than one [bleeding control station] per campus".
Required Trainings	 Asked all Principals to complete the online version of the Behavior Threat Assessment Training from the TSSC.
	 Training needs to be completed by October 29, 2020
Health and Safety	Set future date of meetings
(Facility) Committee	Requires three meetings for year-round districts/charters
МЕОР	Plans for revisions/updates to current MEOP
Campus Safety	Minimum 8 drills per school year
Drills	 Lockout – 1 per school year; Lockdown – 2 per school year; Evacuate – 1 per school year; Shelter in Place- 1 per school year; Hold – 1 per school year; Fire
	 Evacuation – 1 per school year Plan for monitoring Principals on safety drills
